PURPOSE/OBJECTIVES

This session will focus on the evaluation of data standards, consultations to define information needs, and the necessity of stepping back, refocusing and being ready for change. It will identify some of the challenges from the point of collection, to standards development and examine the changing information needs of data users and stakeholders.

FINDINGS/IMPACT/OUTCOMES

The Health Human Resources Minimum Data Set, based on ISO 11179 compliance recommendations, is now operational and not only improving internal processes, deliverables, and timeliness, but is available to guide organizations in the development of information systems to collect health workforce data and ensure alignment and comparability with national statistics.
