PURPOSE/OBJECTIVES

The project objectives are:

- 1) Create an accreditation program (including accreditation standards) for IEN bridging programs in Canada;
- 2) Pilot and evaluate this program; and
- 3) launch the final accreditation program. Ultimately, this project will contribute to the facilitated integration of IENs into the Canadian nursing workforce.

FINDINGS/IMPACT/ OUTCOMES

It is anticipated that this project will result in a national standard for educational programming for **IEN** education. Uptake of the accreditation program expected to be high, as many program coordinators educators have participated in this project. Additionally, a consensus based approach will assist in the adoption of the program. The uptake of the accreditation program will lead to quality improvement and increase consistency bridging programs across Canada.

CONCLUSIONS

Inconsistencies in programming and fluctuating quality in IEN education are disadvantages to IENs. An accreditation program bridging programs IEN creates a way for CASN, bridging programs for IENs, and other stakeholders to work together towards a sustainable method for promoting quality improvement.
